A career member of the Senior Executive Service, Franklin C. Moore, was appointed as Senior Development Counselor to the U.S. Mission to the United Nations Agencies in Rome in August of 2010

Previous to his appointment, Mr. Moore served as Deputy Assistant Administrator for U.S. Agency for International Development's (USAID) Africa Bureau in since the end of 2007. Mr. Moore has served as Director of the Office of Environment and Science Policy within the Agency's Bureau for Economic Growth, Agriculture and Trade (EGAT) since October 2002; and as the Acting Deputy Assistant Administrator and Director for the Agency's Global Center for the Environment.

Prior to joining USAID in 1998, Mr. Moore held positions in the areas of agriculture, environment and national resource management with the U.S. Environmental Protection Agency, with Africare resident in Zimbabwe and Malawi; with Peace Corps and as a Lecturer at Virginia State (College) University and the University of Science and Technology in Kumasi, Ghana.

Mr. Moore has a bachelor's degree in Economics with a minor in Art History from Yale University. He received a master's degree in Agricultural Economics, as well as a certificate in African Studies from the University of Wisconsin-Madison. Mr. Moore studied for a Ph.D. in Development Studies at the University of Wisconsin-Madison (Agriculture/Natural Resource Economics, Political Science and Rural Sociology). Mr. Moore has lived in both West and Southern Africa; he has worked in approximately 40 countries overseas.
